The last contact I had with our former President, Derek Clampin, who died on the 26th of October was about a week before. He phoned me to say that on October the 14th he had reached a full 70 years of ACU membership. All those years being with the Castle club, which he joined in 1947. Just before he put the phone down, he mentioned he would have to have his lungs drained. His sudden passing was a shock – and occurred after the medical procedure. He died at home with his daughter, Nicola, who saw his last and peaceful breath. He was 90 years



of age and had been driving his BMW just a few days before his end. Active until the last, it is perhaps a little too much to say his passing was a tragedy – but nevertheless, a hell of a lot of people will miss him.

Born in 1926, in the same house which saw his demise, he went to the local school and later to one in Colchester. His father Frank was a builder and later, Derek and his younger brother, Ray, took on the business His interest in motorcycles was kindled just before the Second World War when he push-biked to Wakes Colne to see the early scrambles and attended a trial held at Bradwell near to Braintree. His first motorcycle was an elderly Rudge, which he rode on the fields and his first road machine was a 1928 AJS. Having joined the Castle club and keen to enter the sport, his competition debut was in the: "Royal Enfield Cup" trial of 1948, which was organised by that club. R.F. ("Dick") Williams, lent his 350cc Ariel for Derek to compete on, and on this borrowed mount, Derek finished runner-up. Suitably impressed, Dick supplied the machine again for an Ipswich trial, where Derek won a first class award.

He had now updated his road bike to a 350cc ohc Norton, on which his girl friend - later to



be his wife – Jean, occupied the pillion, but having seen a brand new, pukka B32 competition BSA, in a dealers window, Derek duly purchased it for £162/10s – a considerable sum in those days.

With competitive machinery. Derek launched into regular trials meetings, representing the Castle club along with Dick Williams and Gerry Wheeler. It must be remembered that in those days "Inter-club" competition had some priority over "individual" contests and these meetings were allied to road trials and included sidecars in the yearly championship series. Derek's talent began to shine through and in the 1952 Centre championship, he came second overall and the following year, secured the top spot. 1954 saw him drop to 3rd, but in 1956 he came back to win his second overall trials championship with Castle taking the club honours. This era was also the time of many riders - often in groups - riding their trials machines to meeting venues and removing their lights in order to ride the trial. The lights were re-fitted after the trial for the ride home - sometimes actually leaving in darkness. At the "Beggars Roost" National event - a favourite of Derek's - not only the lights were removed but a change of sprockets was needed to

undertake the sections, after he – with Jean on the pillion – had ridden to Devon from Colchester.

In 1954 Derek attended his first Centre Board meeting representing the Castle club, together with again, Dick Williams. Matters of the heart were duly legitimised by Derek and Jean's marriage in 1955. In 1958, he was asked by the Competitions Committee to act as Team Manager for the annual Inter-Centre Team Trial. This was a task he was to shoulder for over a decade and in so doing, he took the trials teams to locations all over the country. 1959 proved an important year. His daughter Nicola was born and he was finally elected - after many attempts - for a seat on the hotly contested Centre Competitions Committee. From then on, his official roles increased and he eventually became a Centre delegate to the ACU itself - firstly at Pall Mall and then at Rugby. His acquired qualifications enabled him to act as steward at National events. Further on. he would represent the ACU at meetings abroad, serving duties on FIM juries. In 1985 he was elected to the ACU Trials and Enduro Committee.



All that time Derek rode when he could. The sport might have been changing but Derek embraced those changes and in the 1960's he could see the era of his beloved big British four-stroke was waning in trials competition and he duly purchased a Bultaco – a lightweight two-stroke. It was on this bike that he won his first "Greybeards" trial – a National event, inspired by the late Ralph Venables, to specifically cater for the older rider and set a trend which greatly extended riders active careers. Derek made several trips to the Scottish Six-Days – usually following the event on a solo trials bike but on one memorable occasion, going round in a side-car piloted by Dave Bickers.



Derek became President of the Eastern Centre in 1978 - a position he would hold until his standing down in 2009. Along the way, he was also made a vice president of the ACU and in 1998, he was made a life-long honorary member of the ACU – an award not given to many.

One milestone in the history of trials riding, was the introduction by law and echoed by the ACU rules, of crash helmets to replace the "flat hat" headgear, worn by trials riders since the sport began. As this change got under way, Derek would inspect and stamp helmets presented at his house. Another campaign which would prove of direct benefit to the sport, was his fundraising for the then Norfolk and Suffolk Air ambulance and at the presentation of the actual helicopter, he headed a party to be present at the launch.

Derek was very much a man who enjoyed the social side of club life and for many years he and Jean would organise club dinners and Centre functions – a duty he carried on after Jean sadly died in 2007. Possibly the highlight was the celebration of the ACU's centenary with a special "hundred years" gathering at Earls Colne golf club – where the Chairman of the ACU itself, Col "Ted" Bartlett and his wife, were guests of honour. Inevitably, none of these functions were complete without Derek hosting a game of "heads and tails" to generate funds for some charity or other.

In his earlier days, Derek had ridden in the London-to-Brighton run on veteran motorcycles supplied by Don French but in his last competitive ride, in 2016, Derek took part in the "Banbury Run" on a 1913 "Bown" two-stroke restored by himself and Dave Bickers. He duly finished - as in his very first event - second in his class and reported some "near misses" on steep-hill descents with the old bike's very primitive brakes! That sums up Derek. Always ready to have a: "good go". Always interested in motorcycling, either on or off the bike – always interested in people from where ever they came. Conversations often punctuated and wrapped around with the smoke of his pipe – always approachable and always affable - Its difficult to follow all that in just one lifetime.



Recollection Section

Sidge Kenny

As Centre archivist, I see my job as collecting and recording the ingredients of events and history, which over the years, puts together a solid organisation. "Tradition" can be a variable



term in its proper meaning - but mark my words, in or out of Brexit, this country almost runs on it; from rolling cheeses down a hill, to the last night of the Proms, tradition is woven in the very backbone of good old England. And that is how I view my role: to receive, and record the activities, the clubs, the people, the high points and the unhappy occurrences along the way. All this material in effect, can build up our own "tradition" by way of "establishment" – another word which, in its various meanings, holds a great deal of sway in our society.

I can't claim to have started any of this, In the ACU, 20 Region (Centres) state, we in the East are now one of the bigger players. It is sad to note that due to lack of officials, some of our colleagues in Regions across the nation are having difficulties to such an extent that the ACU officialdom has to assist in some of their functions. We, on the other hand are self-sufficient and even in these difficult times, run a commendable amount of various meetings in a fifty-one week year – including some of National prominence. Our affiliated club numbers still remain at around the mid-thirties. This happy state I put down to the solid foundations laid in the re-forming of the Eastern Centre less than a year after the Second World War ended – during which, all motorcycle sport was suspended - and I place the main accolade for this durable organisation to Mr William (Bill) Swann who was Centre Secretary for thirty-one years and rock solid in his service to the sport and Centre.

I can confidently speak for Bill – who oddly, has no trophy or memorial event to his name – because I have the piles of records - all in old fashioned files - he handed on to his successor: Ken Davis, and then they were passed to subsequent secretaries when, probably through lack of space, it was decided to appoint an official archivist and pass the ever increasing weight of documents, on to me! Not that I'm complaining. I find reading through the files of meetings, reports, letters and results, a fascinating business and I must admit to often being side-tracked, when perhaps looking for certain items and running completely down the wrong but nonetheless intriguing, route. Sadly, I have found that the historical documentation is not at all complete – there are gaps and I doubt these now will ever be filled. The 1920's and 30's are very sketchy – unfortunate - though there is more than enough material to build up an absorbing history of the Eastern Centre (region) and indeed the Centre's contribution to the sport as a whole.

The "Centre" system arose out of the Auto-cycle Union's desire to unify its control on motorcycling – which, in the earlier days gave equal inclusion to ordinary road-riders as to competition performers. Rather like the county cricket clubs relationship to the MCC, the ACU was seeking to create a set of rules and conduct which would apply to motorcyclists all over the country These developments were being discussed as early as 1910 - but to the best of my knowledge and the available documentation, this Centre was not formed until 1921, with just a handful of clubs. Norwich, Ipswich and Southend, were there at the start. As an example of that intriguing history, another club included in the founding, was: the "Pelly Wheelers" and I have never found out where they were located – or exactly how many wheels were involved as "Light cars" were included in member clubs for many years.

There is no doubt the sport, overseen by the ACU, has progressed massively and there have, at times, been calls for more "professionalism" to be employed. If we take that meaning of the word to describe effective, efficient and safe operations, then, who could argue at that? Yet essentially what I see both in the archives and the present day, is a movement populated by enthusiasts who share a common cause. Call our particular location "Region" or call it "Centre" - we have a great deal to be proud about and the prospects seem pretty good.

Notes from ACU Eastern Trials Forum November 2nd 2017

The 2017 Trials Forum on November 2nd was attended by 27 riders or organisers representing 12 clubs, the full minutes will be posted on the ACU Eastern website, here are some points of note.

For 2018 all centre trials championships will remain the same as 2017 except the Novice class will revert to the B Class rounds alongside the Twin-shocks, whilst still riding the white route.

There is still an opportunity for any clubs to run additional D Class (Sidecar) championship trials.

It was decided to go ahead with a facebook page, Mr Nash offered to set it up and Mr Nash, Mr Kibble and Mr Adam Keeble offered to be moderators, the title was proposed as "ACUE Motorcycle Trials".

To encourage beginners in trials, in particular youth riders on electric bikes, it is planned to organise some training for volunteers to become ACU Approved Club level trainers, anyone interested should contact Paul Nash.

Clubs organising trials under a club or restricted invitation permit will not have to have regulations published in the gazette, all Open permit regulations do need to be published.

It was decided that ACUE trials championship will remain as stop allowed, Pre 70 is no-stop. For non ACUE championship rounds it was confirmed clubs can use stop allowed or no-stop. It was agreed that it would be helpful if permit applications and regulations stated what rules would apply.

It was agreed to accept a proposal for a single class Pre 70 B class championship, run on the next route down from the current Pre 70 A class, in some cases this will be a 50/50 route. The Pre 70 A class machine eligibility rules will apply to B class.

For 2018 the trials committee remains mainly as for 2017 with the addition of James Newstead.

Trials Committee agreed for 2018 as Paul Nash and Chris Cook (Joint Chairman), Clive Dopson (Secretary), Alan Foskew (Stewards Coordinator), David Cordle (Recorder), Kevin Hood, Paul Fenn, Eddie Hood, Matthew Neale, Nick Ogden, James Newstead.

Trials Seminars for Clerk of Course and Steward Licences planned for December 16th and a date in early 2018, details will be on the website, the Trials Committee would request that any candidates request both Clerk of Course and Steward Licence.

RENEWALS ONLY - NEW NUMBERS AVAILABLE FROM 4th FEBRUARY

Now is the time to renew your number for 2018. If you want to ensure you keep the same number for the 2018 season, you must renew after 30th November and by 31st January 2018 at the latest. NO NUMBERS WILL BE HELD AFTER THIS DATE.

Any numbers not renewed by 31st January will be made available on a first come, first served basis. If you have not renewed your number by this date there is every possibility that you could lose it to another rider. There were in the region of 700 numbers sold for 2017 so if you don't want to lose your number, renew it NOW.

You can renew your number online at www.easternacu.org or if you prefer by using the postal form on the opposite page.

The cost of reserving your number remains at £5 per season. If reserving the number online an extra 39p is added to cover the fees we are charged by PayPal. This ensures that the chosen charities (in 2016 they are East Anglian Air Ambulance, Essex Air Ambulance & ACU Benevolent Fund) do not lose out, and is still cheaper than sending the application form by post.

Numbers 1 – 50 are kept for experts only. Number 1 will be offered to the Centre Champion; in the event that the champion declines, number 1 will not be issued.

In the past 3 years this scheme has enabled the ACU Eastern, on behalf of riders, to make donations of more than £10,000 to the chosen charities.
