# Mark's Progress

In the intervening month Mark has ridden through many states USA since his entry into

California. He has commented on finding things easier now he is in an English- speaking country and judging by the sights he has seen over this particular stint in his travels, it has been an almost hectic schedule. Going north east through Arizona into Colorado, Mark was particularly impressed by Monument Valley where many of the old western films were shot in an area of massive rock outcrops seemingly growing out of the sand. He favoured this area over the Grand Canyon to the west and Yosemite National park further west in California, thinking those as being too commercial. Another extremely arid and hot area was Death Valley, and here Mark endured a sand storm, yet in



contrast was Lake Tahoe, featuring lush forests and cold mountains which he rode over in snow with a view of the still waters- all of this was in one state: California!

It did not end there. Back on the West Coast, he walked through the forest of giant Redwood trees; huge and totally awe-inspiring. Then he progressed northwards into Oregon Here he encountered other memories of the man-made variety. At the Evergreen museum in Mcminnville, Mark was able to view the astonishing "Spruce Goose," a mammoth aeroplane - a one off, manufactured by the Hughes aircraft company headed by the reclusive Howard Hughes - and constructed of wood, with a 330 foot wingspan and featuring eight propeller engines of 3000hp each! . Mark also took in many other historic aircraft as well as the space shuttle and at Hood River, visited a couple of vehicle museums. Ever northwards, Mark is going on into Washington State and he is to pass through the Rockies - or ride along them, according to my atlas - on his way to Alaska. Prior to those rigours, faithful Bertha the BMW, will have a well-earned service.



#### **Recollection Section**

Sidge Kenny

On July 19th 1964, I finished fifth in the Eastern Centre Grass-track championships, a single meeting event held at Langford near Maldon and organised



by E.S.S.A. as they did for several years during the 1960's. Nothing much to write home about except besides riding my 250cc Greeves scrambler, I had also borrowed a 500cc AJS to extend my day's racing. However, the big winner of the day was the incomparable Alf Hagon, riding his own manufactured bikes powered by JAP and BSA engines.

Today of course many will merely associate him with the suspension units which bear his name but in my opinion I do not think Alf Hagon has been given the recognition he deserves — on so many fronts, particularly as he is of Eastern Centre (Region) origins. Personally, I would put him up along with Brian Stonebridge and Sammy Miller as individuals who literally shaped motorcycle sport and steered its many disciplines into what we see today. With Alf, it is difficult to know where to start. His riding career, starting in the late 1940's embraced so many areas, including representing the UK in speedway as well as racing in the Clubmans TT and in hill climbs. Perhaps though it is on the grass and on the tarmac and concrete strips that his biggest impact was made. Not only as a rider, with countless Centre and British Grass Championships to his name but as a designer, engineer and bike builder. As proof, the sport of grass track racing is virtually totally devoted to using the lightweight speedway style of bike which others might have favoured — but which Alf built and developed. Always one to keep it light and simple, those funny rubber band controlled forks on grass bikes, were an innovation of his.

Engines too went all the quicker under Alf's hand – including the unit construction BSA – which again on the grass, was phenomenally fast. His preference seemed however to lie with the - even then - somewhat ancient JAP engine and therein comes another twist, for Alf's arguably finest hours were in drag racing, a discipline we seldom discuss in these pages. With a radically tuned and supercharged V twin JAP in one of his own frames, he exceeded 200mph at Honington air base in 1968 – the first man to do so on British soil. He had already broken the 10 second barrier in quarter mile standing start sprints. I had the honour of watching him at Duxford in 1967 on the JAP dragster and always feared that if the massively stressed cylinder heads of the blown V –twin engine, running on a nitro-methanol-mix, were ever to let go – Alf's chest was lying on top of them!..

The brief times I was able to talk with him, he recalled making a frame for our own Jack Hubbard - then residing in the Channel Islands – for sand racing and had to install a Bultaco engine, supplied by Rickman brothers. They insisted the motor would only operate properly if the exhaust outlet was placed perfectly central. Alf could not do this on his grass track frame so he simply disregarded the edict and swung the exhaust outlet around the down tube. And many of us

will remember how successful Jack was on that bike both on the sand and back home on grass.

Alf is well retired now but the genes duly passed on to his son Martin, who himself was a top flight grass and speedway performer in the 1980's .In researching this article, I learned one other thing. Alf's racing number was invariably "350" — which I thought referred to his frequent 350cc championships. In reality it represented the address of his business: 350, Leyton High Road.

I forgot to mention that my races were back to back and the last 3 races were back to back so by the time the final came I was absolutely worn out."

Eastern EVO Championship Brad Tomlin won all four races.

Halstead rider Lewis Tombs (Lings Husqvarna) has put in some excellent performances in the British Maxis MX2. At Hawkstone Park Rd 4 he had a 10th in the first race, In the second race he had a bad crash on the first lap & again later on finishing 21st.
