Foreword Phil Armes

I don't want to count my chickens, or put the editorial equivalent of the commentators curse on

forthcoming events, but it's looking like being a brilliant year for the Eastern Centre with riders and teams bringing back a host of silverware and titles to our region.



One success is already confirmed, with young Ryan Vickers from Thetford crowned as the National Superstock 600 champion after wrapping up the title at Silverstone recently with two rounds to spare. Riding the Mototechnics Yamaha he heads to the final round at Brands Hatch on the 14th October looking to go through the entire season unbeaten – which would be a remarkable achievement in such a ferociously competitive class.

King's Lynn Stars have had a fantastic season in both the SGB Premiership and the Knock Out Cup; heading the league table at the end of the regular season, and taking victory in the opening leg of the play off semi final at Belle Vue. They will hope to use home advantage in the second leg to make it through to the final to give them a chance of wrapping up a league and cup double over the coming weeks.

October 14th sees the final round of the Maxxis British Motocross Championship at Lyng, in Norfolk, replacing the event that was washed away by the awful weather in March. Heading the MX1 class is Ipswich's Jake Nicholls, and it would be tremendous if he can clinch the title in front of his home fans. Riding the Buildbase Honda he has already lifted one national crown, and by the time he arrives at Lyng could also be the Eastern Centre champion (after the final round on September 30th).

On more mundane issues it's that time of year when we all need to plan for next season, and I have sent out the date application forms to all clubs so that we can put together the calendar for 2019. Please make every effort to get them back to me before the 26th October so that we can have a provisional calendar prior to the AGM/Board meeting on November 11th. If you haven't received a copy of the forms please let me know and I will get them to you by return.

For those of you who need your National Motocross Clerk of the Course licence renewing the ACU will be holding a seminar on Sunday 25th November at Rugby so please make sure you have your application completed and sent in.

And finally, the ACU have announced that competition licence fees will be going up for 2109. Adult licences, and Minors aged over 13 will be £52.00; Minors 12 years and below will be £30.00; Trials Registration £12.00; and One Event licences £15.00.

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Concussion Procedure ACU Head Office. Rugby

During 2015 the ACU introduced a procedure for Riders who have sustained Concussion by an Injury at ACU events. But recently at has been noted that in some cases Clubs have not been notifying the ACU Head Office of rider's names that have sustained Concussion.

The Concussion Procedure came as a result of the question 'how do Organisers of ACU events find out that someone has been injured and as a result are suffering from Concussion?'

Please can we remind all clubs that it was decided that the ACU Head Office should be made aware that an individual has been injured and consequently diagnosed with concussion so that the rider can be placed on the Stop List. In all cases, please inform ACU Head Office on the Monday morning following your event of any rider who has suffered Concussion through injury and the respective discipline Secretary will inform respective Organisers.

If a competitor has been injured on a Saturday and is suffering from Concussion – and the Organiser is aware that the rider was intending to ride or is scheduled to rider somewhere else the next day, the Organiser is requested to inform the Organiser of the event being held the next day so they are aware of the rider's injuries and as such he is prevented from participating in that event. Also, in addition please inform me of any rider who has been concussed so I can do a quick search on the ACU Permit system remotely on the Saturday and then inform Organisers for events being held the next day that a rider has been concussed in case he has entered or intends to ride at their event.

The recovery time for anyone diagnosed with concussion was recently discussed at the ACU Medical Panel and are as follows:

Over 20 years: Excluded immediately for the following 48 hours, with a further 7 days (as a minimum) suspension from competition (nine days in total).

16-19 years: 12 days

15 and under: 23 days

In all cases, evidence is required that the individual is fit to participate in competition which means they will be required to produce a doctors' letter/statement. This should then be forwarded to ACU Head Office (email: licence@acu.org.uk) and the individual will be removed from the Stop List.

Again for ease, my mobile number is 07976 548375 should any Organiser need to contact me to let me know that a rider has Concussion resulting from a racing incident which other Organisers need to be made aware.



Recollection Section

The first time, I heard the word "line" used in connection with the path a motorcycle (or car) takes on the track and primarily mainly through corners,



was actually in reading the reports in "The Motor Cycle", a weekly journal in the 1950s. From a by-line of "Continental Commentary", the road racer, Fergus Anderson, recounted his road racing exploits with detailed descriptions of his - and others - contests to get to the chequered flag first.

To explain certain racing manoeuvers — Anderson would describe the different "line" he would take on a bend or in a corner. He also used the term to describe the fastest way through a series of bends It was so unusual that the word itself in those reports was wrapped in quotes. Over the years the word "line", in relation to racing technique — in any aspect of motor sport - is now used all the time, without any thought to its origin.

The interesting thing about "lines" is that they are also a vital part of geometry and indeed the fastest line around regular bends or corners, such as might be found in speedway, is itself geometric. However other factors come into the equation in trying to get through a certain hazard quicker than anyone else and two dimensional geometry has sometimes to give way to a third dimension:- i.e. bumps! This is illustrated best on road circuits, such as on the Isle of Man, where T.T. Riders often have to trade the seemingly quickest line through a bend and deviate in order to avoid particularly severe bumps. At the speeds they go, it is quicker and safer to alter the line rather than hang on to a very upset motorcycle. Motocross riders also have this sort of consideration but to a much larger level. Here, it might be other factors on the circuit which spoils the quest for a perfect line — a severe adverse camber or - if it is wet - deep mud, where the correct line will vary as the race goes on. The canny lads in this sector of the sport will observe whilst walking the course before the racing starts, any alternative lines to be used when the circumstances force it. Quite often in either sport, it is what follows a corner or bend which dictates its line. The object always is to get through the combined section of the course in the quickest fashion.

Speedway with its apparent simple layout of an oval circuit, would appear to offer a virtually perfect geometrical proposition as to the fastest line through the bend. This would be to approach the bend from the outside, clip the inside at the apex and then soar away again on the outside. But rarely will that work when three other blokes are also in the desperate contest for fastest man through and getting maximum points for the win. Besides, the shale might offer better drive well off the apparent correct route.

Additionally, in the hurley- burley of any racing, the perfect line through a bend might well be adhered to but the other major factor is speed. Too much spells disaster! Good judgement is required at all levels. Yet what might we hear from a rueful rider who has had to pick himself up and get his bike straightened out?

" - Damn it! - I was slightly off line...."
