While on the subject of the women's race at Lyng, I found it interesting that although there has been a women's world motocross championship for a number of years, there are very few, if any, ACU permitted events which include a women's race; and certainly no (ACU sanctioned) British Championship. This of course means the women have to race with the men as they come through the ACU ranks in order to be able to move up to world championship level with an FIM licensing authority. Judging by the feedback at Lyng perhaps now is the time for the ACU to run a women's championship with the Maxxis series.

For those of you that like to get out on the open road and test your navigational skills (although I suspect SatNavs have made map reading skills a thing of the past) it's that time of year when you should be thinking of the National Rally. This year it is over the weekend of July 6/7th and full information can be found at; nationalroadrally.co.uk

At the Centre board meeting on April 17th there was much discussion and debate with regard to reducing the number of board meetings held during the year, and whether the frequency should be reduced. Ultimately there will now be two board meetings, plus the AGM, and one sustainability/ development meeting. Lee Hardy Racing

Breeding Ground For British Superbike Talent

It may be hard to believe, especially in the high cost, high speed world of the British Superbike

Championship, but the Norfolk based team, Lee Hardy Racing, have taken just five years to go from entering the class to coming within one round of potentially winning the title! Along the way, they have created an enviable reputation for developing some of the finest riders in the UK.

When Lee Hardy guit racing, he used the money that would have been spent on his track activity to sponsor a young rider and in 2012 after agreeing a deal with Neil Tuxworth from Honda UK for the supply of a Superstock 1000, he made his first foray into the British Championship paddock. Just two years later and still with Honda powered machinery, he dipped his toe into BSB, with the highly talented Simon Andrews. It was a steep learning curve and not made any easier by taking on the might of full factory teams, with a pretty restricted budget. Unfortunately, Simon lost his life at the North West 200 riding for the Penz team and understandably. Lee wasn't too sure whether to carry on, or walk away from the sport he loved.



A subsequent conversation with Peter Hickman, who had just set a new benchmark lap time for a newcomer at the Isle of Man TT races at an astounding 129.1mph, led to him signing up to the team for the rest of the 2014 campaign. Peter notched a couple of points scoring finishes with his first ride in the (now) RAF Regular & Reserve sponsored outfit. He went on to give Lee Hardy his first BSB victory in Round 8 at Cadwell Park, which he openly admits "took some time to really sink in and proved to be something of an emotional weekend."

The team retained the services of Hickman for 2015, but changed over to BMW machinery, which once again provided a new set of challenges. They had to learn how to get the best out of the bikes, for both BSB and the major International Road Race events, including the TT, Ulster Grand Prix, and Macau Grand Prix. In what could only be described as a successful season, Hickman finished 9th in the domestic series, grabbed top five and podium finishes on the major UK roads events and ended the year by winning at the Far East finale.

By now, the rest of the pit lane was casting respectful eyes towards the (comparatively) small team from Norfolk, but their stock wasn't high enough to retain Peter the following year. Peter joined the GBMoto factory supported Kawasaki squad. Alistair Seeley replaced him, to challenge for both BSB and NW200 honours. Despite a podium finish at his home event, the Northern Irishman never really settled to the BMW superbike and by mid season Lee was in discussions to give 20 year old Jake Dixon a test at Snetterton in Norfolk. The former Supersport 600 frontrunner, grabbed the opportunity with both hands and finished the test faster than his more established potential team mate, going on to finish an outstanding sixth in his first race for the team, at their local track, just two weeks later.

For 2017 the team was reduced to just one rider again, mainly due to budgetary considerations, and it was Dixon that was given the nod to ride the all new Kawasaki machinery that Lee had sourced over the winter months. What should have been the start of something very special,



quickly unravelled with new faces within the pit crew walking out at round 2, requiring help from other teams in the pit lane to allow Jake to take his place on the start line. Major changes were made, with MSS Engineering being tasked with preparing the engines, and former British Champion Glen Richards joining the set up as Crew Chief/Mentor to steady the ship. The watershed moment came at Knockhill just two events later when Dixon gave the RAF Regular & Reserve their first ever double win in the British Superbike Championship.

and a run of form that would see him finish sixth in the final standings in his first full season.

As the new campaign dawned Lee Hardy Racing went into its fifth season of, arguably, the world's best domestic road race championship, as well prepared as it had ever been, with the same line up in the pits and on the bike. Pre-season testing at Cartagena in Spain went well but early results didn't match the level of expectation. Round 3 at Oulton Park was the turning point, and from then on Jake Dixon was on podium pace and pushing Leon Haslam all the way for the Superbike crown. It was only a mechanical failure, at the penultimate round in the Netherlands, that robbed the team from taking the title race to the final triple header at Brands Hatch.

The development of Dixon as a rider has undeniably not gone unnoticed, with the 21 year old making the most of a Moto2 Grand Prix wild card ride during 2018. This, has ultimately led to a full time ride in Grands Prix this year, something that Lee Hardy is justifiably proud of. He was just a tad frustrated, as he had signed young Norfolk talent Ryan Vickers for 2019, and would have viewed a Dixon/Vickers two rider set up as his "dream team."

Vickers is very much in the mould of his predecessor, in that he is a hungry young rider and he joins after a sensational season when he captured the Superstock 600 title having won all but two rounds – one where he failed to finish, and one where he was taking a wild card in the Supersport world championship at Donington Park. The young man from Thetford, who is only in his fourth full season of road racing, after a successful youth motocross career,

has been mentored by former 250cc GP rider Alan Carter over the last 18 months and fully recognises the positive affect that this has had on his approach to racing.

There is no doubt that this will be a massive step up for the 20 year old from Norfolk, but while most people were wrapping their Christmas presents in December, Ryan was in Spain having his first ride on the team superbike, and setting some pretty impressive times. While no-one, least of all Lee Hardy, will be putting any pressure on his new protégé the final word has to go to the big bike rookie himself who said, "I would like to be on or around the points in the opening rounds, but will be aiming to be at the sharp end by the end of the season."



Recollection Section

You might well describe the site in Wades lane, Raydon, Suffolk, as just a scruffy little sandpit – with untidy vegetation, bracken, and bushes growing as best they can in the unpromising soil. There is even evidence of



a bit of fly tipping within its fenceline. Yet, time out of number, this humble little venue has acted as host for countless trials organised by many clubs within the Centre and indeed outside of the ACU. People go along to practice there – all perfectly legal, since there is a landlord and a rent to pay and access is granted in accordance by the gate being unlocked. I first rode there in the late 1950's, belting round a made up scramble circuit with other lads on our converted road bikes – me, having to be the more steady in pace as I had to ride the twenty or more miles to get home.

Since then,I have been to Raydon scores of times - either as a rider, observer,or spectator. Over the years, the site has slowly altered, yet it still can offer an excellent days sport – dependent on the skill of the section plotters. The venue provides steep gradients in short, sharp, ascents, adverse cambers, mud – should it be wet - and most of all, lots and lots of sand. Grip can vary. Some of the banks that are more soil covered, can be very slippery in wet conditions, so a rider has to be on top of his game to do well over this variety of going - which to my estimate, is contained within an area of something like a hectare.

Its location is also of interest. Very often a winter event will face all concerned with a chilling wind as the little pit is perched high above the surrounding countryside. Yet on a nice day you get a superb view of the Suffolk landscape at its best – stretched out below almost like a John Constable canvas. You can see right to the outskirts of Hadleigh itself, some three or four miles to the North. But on trials days, all observation is limited to noting the number of marks the riders lose as they come through the sections.

In the "good old days", (were they ever that good?) Raydon would have provided one or two - or a full group of sections in a trial which would have contained roadwork and from memory I think some trials would have directed riders to the Raydon pit from sections located at Higham, or Stratford-St-Mary - even from Cattawade and East Bergholt - and then, having ridden the sections there, to go further on,the to the outskirts of Hadleigh. Sadly, none of this takes place in trials nowadays and it is unlikely ever to return – but Raydon pit continues to act as the host site for many trials and practice sessions – and it has a further virtue as having sufficient car parking space within its boundary which is hardly ever effected by bad weather

I am fully aware that in this Eastern Centre (Region), we have had many other similar locations that have served for our sport admirably over many decades but they are becoming noticably fewer – most particularly in the Essex sector, where "creeping urbanisation" has lost for us so many of these previous sites. Therefore, I simply highlight Wades Lane as an example, along with all the other odd little or larger locations we use – or have used – and say a heartfelt: "thank you" for those many years of :"flat out fun" we`ve enjoyed and hopefully will be allowed to enjoy in the future.

MOTOCROSS NEWS

Motocross started to get busy in the Eastern region in April, but the first adult meeting was at Wakes Colne on March 31st, when the Halstead club organised the first Graham "Chick" Garrod memorial event.

It was a great gesture by the Garrod family to present the trophies to the C group of junior grade riders as these guys normally only race for fun with no reward. The first ever recipient of this trophy went to Lewis Dorling. A big well done to



the crew at Halstead, who have been working hard to improve this facility with new fencing, buildings, and a revamped circuit. It is all still very much a work in progress situation at present, but all credit to the club who are striving to bring this iconic venue back to equal past glories.

As far as the racing went, Lewis Tombs has jumped at the chance of riding for the Buildbase Honda team, and took victory in all three moto's, with 2018 Eastern champion, Shaun Southgate, as runner up.

It was good to see several younger experts in the mix as well. The NGR over 30's first round was a cracker, boosted by half a dozen new former experts joining the series. Will Kerry took the overall win, but Chris Thorpe, Mark Hunt, John Hinz and Matt French were all prominent, which bodes well for an exciting season ahead.

Next up was round one of the Bickers Lifting/Stebbings Car Superstore sponsored Eastern championships at Blaxhall, and unfortunately rain and hail arrived at the wrong time for spectators, who may have decided to stay at home in the warm! The going was tough for riders, marshals and officials, but the club managed to get through the 15 race programme on time.

Lewis Tombs continued his good form, winning all three premier class races to take 75 points home with him. 2017 champion, Luke Benstead, was 2nd on all three occasions, with current champion, Shaun Southgate third overall, tying with young MX2 champion, Ben Clark. Racing was fast and furious throughout the pack, and credit must go to all the riders for putting on a good show. The nine riders involved in the new rookies class for 1st and 2nd year non national experts saw Ryan Watts top of the leaderboard, followed by Connor Baldry, Ryan Allison, Ryan McDonnell and Rheis Morter.

Former expert, Kane Fisher, was the overall winner in the junior grade championship standings, with Jack Youngs 2nd, followed by Ryan Powley.

Round two is at Lyng on 16th June, and it is hoped for warmer, dryer weather. Before that, on the motocross front, the Diss club are hosting a British Clubmans sidecar round, plus racing in the NGR over 30's series on 6th May.

Norwich Vikings hosted round two of the Maxxis sponsored British Championships at Lyng on April 14th, and despite the chilly weather, a good sized crowd watched some great racing at a very well prepared circuit. Lots of comments from race fans stating that it was one of the best

British championship rounds that they have watched. The racing in all classes were closely fought, and credit must go to the club for a really first class event. Several local riders put on a good show, including Lewis Tombs, who again had a great day with 4th overall in the MX1 class. Declan Whittle and Luke Benstead picked up a few points, but Shaun Southgate was not so lucky, breaking his collarbone. The MX2 class saw Calum Mitchell and Ben Clark collecting points, and Josh Peters was 4th overall in the MXY2 group after two good rides.

The ladies races were also hotly contested, with Eastern Centre's Amie Goodlad winning race one, and finished 2nd in race two to claim 2nd overall. Credit to all the girls who rode well on the tough Cadders Hill circuit.

Personally, I feel it is a great pity that several other events took place on the same day, including a well supported meeting at Wakes Colne hosted by the EASSC, racing at Chippenham by the Coventry club which included several local riders, plus the Badby meeting over at the South Midland Centre featuring an NGR over 30's round, and an enduro event organised by the Sudbury club.

All this of course, meant that possibly many more spectators could have helped the Vikings club financially.

The next adult meeting in the region will be on May 6th, where the Diss club will be hosting a round of the Clubman's sidecar series, and includes NGR over 30's, and an allcomers line up at the popular Wattisfield Hall venue.

Finally, I can vouch for his generosity – during a Sudbury scramble at Great Cornard over fifty years ago, I broke the rear wheel hub on my machine and Rex instantly loaned me his spare wheel to continue the event – leaving him as often happens, vulnerable should he need it himself. Notes from ACU Eastern Trials Sub-Committee Meeting March 28th 2019

Trials Notes

The first ACU Eastern Trials Sub-Committee meeting of 2019 was held on March 28th, the full minutes, when approved at the next meeting in July, will be posted on the ACU Eastern website. Here are some points of note.

- Chelmsford club will be organising a two-day demonstration event on 15th and 16th of June.

 the results, based on information from the Trials Committee, which bikes do not meet the
 ACUE Pre70 machine eligibility rules and will not score ACUE championship points.

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
