STARTING METHOD-Starts will be with a dead engine, from a fixed start line by group.


HELMETS: Helmets must bear the A.C.U Gold or silver stamp of approval, be in good condition and worn throughout the event.

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Recollection Section

I get more than fed-up when I read, or as happened recently, hear on local radio, of the misdeeds by some of our so-called: 'fellow riders' which include unauthorised riding on private land or in areas controlled by the Forestry Commission. To add insult to injury, the particular radio report on a major police action in the Kings forest near Thetford, let forth the information that some of the

miscreants were not from this region at all but had come from places as far away as Kent and Cambridgeshire. This action by the Police resulted in several convictions and bike confiscations. It had also come on the back of the more reassuring news that Forest land would still be available for properly authorised events.

For some years now, it has been my opinion that we may be on borrowed time when it comes to obtaining the access we have previously enjoyed in running our off-road events on informally hired land. Public perception – an important factor – is being increasingly encouraged to take the view that in our use of fossil- fuelled machines, we are materially adding to the general pollution of the planet. Whilst a sensible look at the wider picture, shows such a view to be well wide of the mark, if you then add the "general nuisance" view of some groups, such as the Ramblers Association, whose ethic deems that motor vehicles as a whole, should not be allowed in the countryside, we, as a movement, do increasingly look like "the bad guys". We should also understand that such media coverage we do get for our sport - welcome as it is - will leave the average citizen with the belief that motorcycle sport is conducted on lavish road race circuits or confined to speedway stadiums. Motocross, grass track and trials are not covered as fully- and, as we all know, every trials rider has to explain to the uninitiated exactly what a motorcycle trial is all about. This overall lack of knowledge and our relatively small numbers, could make our situation regarding countryside land usage, unpopular and somewhat precarious. In cases like the Thetford forest incident, our "old mates," turn out to be in fact, our worse enemies.

Of course, I know very well that the nit-wits who without care or thought ,went into these areas and were caught, would not be members of any of our affiliated clubs – at least, I sincerely hope not. If they were, I would have to suggest that their actions should be seen to be bringing our sport into disrepute and as such, strict measures should be undertaken.

And yet I also have to admit that for as long as motorcycles have been ridden, we have been in trouble. Even on the hallowed soil where motorbikes are forever welcome - the Isle of Man - had a major discussion in their Parliament over a hundred years ago, as to whether the 1913T.T. Races should go ahead after many complaints were made about visiting motorcyclists – which did not of course, involve the "proper" T.T. Riders - removing exhausts, tearing around at excessive speed and generally scaring much more than the horses. In more recent times, we had "mad sunday's" over there - which required Police action. Now, after a two year lull, I can well imagine a movement by some Manx residents, to discontinue the races over the mountain circuit – hopefully this will be counteracted by the same reasons the 1914 TT meeting was allowed to proceed, which was the overwhelming beneficial effect on the Island economy. Money can overcome most things - but bad behaviour can lose you just as much.

At last, the sound of bikes at motocross meetings, albeit with no spectators, which hopefully, fingers crossed, will change from mid May.

Halstead kicked off the season with round one of the Eastern championships at Wakes Colne. The club has worked hard at this iconic venue over the past months, with new fencing, well managed surroundings etc. All results are posted on speedhive, and other various outlets, so no need to mention race positions, points etc However, it was really good to see several youngsters doing so well in their first adult journey into the sport. Some of the credit must

go to youth organisations, particularly the Norfolk and Suffolk club, for nurturing the riders at their early stages of racing.

Quite a few lads even made the Premier class, including Ollie Beamish, Jake Rackham, Callum Murfitt, Archie Fisher, Ethan Martin, and the twin brothers, Alby and Harry Smith, so a big well done. Star of the day was Lewis Tombs, who won all three moto's riding the Banks Honda. Lewis has recently stated that he no longer will compete in National events, so hopefully, we will see a lot more of him at local meetings. Behind him, Declan Whittle, Shaun Southgate, Luke Benstead, Luke Parker and Josh Peters battled hard, such a pity that race fans missed some great sport.

Sussex youngster, Ollie Beamish, took maximum points in the junior championship category. Ollie comes from a long line of top riders of course. Dad is Danny Beamish, uncles Steve Beamish and Billy Aldridge, and grandad was the late Graham Beamish, all top British riders in their time. Fakenham's Matt Pope has returned to the sport, and finished 2nd in the junior championship points.

Next meeting was the open class and round one of the NGR over 30's championships at a sunny, but cold Blaxhall. Once again, the club's circuit crew had the place looking immaculate,(I had to smile at the article in TMX, when they analysed the British Championship circuits. The article regarding Blaxhall stated that the place was so clean, that you had to wipe your shoes when getting out of the car!) I take that as a big compliment. Racing was closely fought in all classes, and the surprise was to see two-time former British MX2 champion, Elliott Banks-Browne in action for the first time in almost a year. Elliott won all three group A races but was hard pushed by Luke Benstead and Lewis Tombs. Once again, several youngsters qualified in the top group, and certainly did not disgrace themselves.

Top of the junior pile was Norfolk's Bayliss Utting, who was the leading junior grade rider in all three moto's. Bayliss won youth trophies in practically every class when he was competing in the Eastern youth championships, and it looks like that will continue now that he is racing in the adults.

Matt Pope continued his good form by winning all three legs in the NGR races, with former champions, Will Kerry and Tim Clark, 2nd and 3rd overall. It seems that the over 30's series is still proving popular, with a full line up in action at Blaxhall. This is actually the 33rd year of the series, originally instigated by the late Nigel Read.

The Diss club's meeting will be next on the calendar. Round two of the Eastern championships will take place at the fast Wattisfield Hall circuit on May 9th; then on May 23rd, hopefully with a big crowd allowed, the Vikings will be hosting round three of the Revo sponsored RHL/ACU British championships at Lyng. As long as spectators are allowed, this should be a must for all race fans. It will be back to Blaxhall on May 30th at the end of a busy month, for round three of the Eastern championships.

I end on a sour note to learn that yet another rider has had his bikes stolen. Expert Ollie Brader has lost both of his KTM bikes recently. Please do what you can to ensure that low life scum cannot pinch your pride and joys.







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Woodbridge Open Motocross Inc. NCR R1

Sunday 25th May 2021 saw the Woodbridge DMCC club host their first race meeting of the year at the Blaxhall Circuit. With Covid restriction still in place the event was held without spectators at the venue, but a strong line of 160 riders enjoyed a great day's racing.

The meeting featured the opening round of the NGR Championship for over 30's along with 3 groups of Expert and Junior riders in a 12-race programme.

In the NGR Championship group it was Matt Pope on the Matt Pope Motorcycles Kawasaki who took the opening race win after moving forward to pass early race lead Will Kerry for the win, while Tim Clark took third ahead of Leon Woodford in fourth and Mark Hunt in fifth.

The second race once again saw Pope take the race win by over 20 seconds ahead of John Hinz and Will Kerry in third, with Sean Wright and Tim Clark taking fourth and fifth. Pope made it three out of three to claim the overall in the final race taking the win ahead of John Hinz, Tim Clark, Sean Wright and Will Kerry. Pope ended the day with the overall victory ahead of Will Kerry and Tim Clark.

In the A Group a number of the Expert rider topped the entry list along with the fastest Junior riders on the day. It was the former two times British Champion Elliott Banks-Browne who was the fastest in qualifying and competing in his first race for over 15 months. The opening race saw Banks-Browne in a race long battle with Luke Benstead, with Banks-Browne taking the victory over Benstead, Lewis Tombs in third and Tom Grimshaw and Luke Parker taking fourth and fifth. The top Junior in the race was young Bayliss Utting in 14th as he competed in his first adult event.

The second race saw drama on the start when Banks-Browne stalled the bike going into the second turn and had to restart from almost dead last. At the front Tombs was in the lead and battling to stay ahead of the chasing pack, while Banks-Browne was moving forward at a very quick pace. Towards the end of the race Banks-Browne had moved into second and took the



lead with a lap to go and claimed the win ahead of Tombs, Sam Nunn in third and Tom Grimshaw and Luke Parker in fourth and fifth. Once again it was Bayliss Utting as the top Junior in the race in 13th place.

The final A group race saw Banks-Browne make good start and take a start to finish race win to claim a hat trick of race wins and the overall. Second in the race went to Luke Benstead ahead of Lewis Tombs, Sam Nunn and Luke Parker rounding out the top 5. Bayliss Utting finished the race again in 13th as the top Junior.

The A Group overall saw Banks-Browne take the win ahead of Tombs, Nunn, Parker and Benstead making the top 5 overall.

In the B group it was Jack Whitlam who took the overall victory ahead of Thomas Clarke and Ross Young in third. Richard Roper claimed fourth overall after taking two race wins but a DNF in the second race dropped him down the overall with Marcus Smith in fifth overall.

The C Group saw Lee Scott take the overall win ahead of Sam Cushion, Jonathan Finch rounding out the top 3 with Josh Sturman and Robert Green rounding out the top five overall.

After a successful day the Woodbridge DMCC will now prepare for their next meeting on the 30th May where they hope that the Government and ACU guidelines will allow the return of spectators to the event.

15 METHOD OF START

The start will be live engine, clutch type.

No one except <u>RIDERS</u> and <u>OFFICIALS</u> shall be permitted into the area of the starting gate. Riders are advised that the club have a concrete start and that under no circumstances is there to be any grooming or soil added to the concrete area of the start gate.

Once a rider has taken his position at the start gate, he cannot change it. A rider is deemed to be under starter's orders having been called to the start line, when all the riders are on start line the starter will hold up a green flag from which moment the riders are under his control. The starter will hold up a 15 second board for a full 15 seconds, at the end of the 15 seconds, he will hold up a 5 seconds board and the gate will drop between 5 and 10 seconds after the 5 second Board is shown.

16 FINISH OF RACE

Riders must complete at least 50% of the distance of the winner and pass the chequered flag to be classed as a finisher.

All fuel used during an event must comply with 2020 ACU Fuel Regulations
