Recollection Section

This year marks the centenary of the Eastern Centre – or region as it is now.

As archivist I have to admit that I have nothing in my wealth of records and paperwork to certify this - the documentation up to the late 1930's is very sketchy indeed - but the ACU handbook for 1924 – which I do have - contains a report from the Eastern Centre which speaks of a successful "second year in existance" (1923) and the maths are fairly elementary to draw the conclusion that this year does indeed see our, "ton-up."

Compared to today's ACU Handbook with 500 pages packed with regulations, rules, codes of conduct and procedures, the 1924 version was a slim booklet, costing 3/6d (17.5p) and was of just 111 pages with

hardly any reference to the sport. This is because the ACU's function was seen quite differently in those days. Its main purpose was to serve all motorcyclists and at that time, the vast majority were road riders. Accordingly, much space is devoted to roads, maps, and touring. This included hotels, and camping sites. Some of these retreats would exhibit: "ACU" signs to indicate they were pleased to receive motorcycle riders – possibly at a discount. "Lighting up" times, which were much more important then, were given for the various parts of the country. There was also a legal section, dealing with road classifications, the then new road warning signs and advice on what to do in the case of an accident. "Rules of the Road" were laid out to be read and absorbed.


The ACU of 1924 was controlled by a "General Committee" - rather than our present-day Board of Directors. It contained no less than three Lieutenant-Generals, a Brigadier- General, a General, a Vicar, a Professor, and two Knights one of whom was the President. Its offices were in Pall Mall, London, at the same address as the RAC and the ACU was then - as it is now - the smaller associate. I would love to know how much the rent was for those offices and what proportion the ACU had to pay.

Seventeen Centres (We have 20 nowadays, including Scotland) sent delegates to meetings and with the last Centre (the Southern) to affiliate, the entire country was covered. The first two representatives from the Eastern Centre were: Mr E.J. Bass and Mr J.L. Brooks – unfortunately I have no knowledge of which clubs they came from. In 1924, there were 270 motorcycle clubs in the whole country.

The specific report on the Eastern Centre in 1924 shows its second year of operations (1923) was a busy one and the numbers of clubs duly affiliated, rose from 13 to 14. Three clubs actually joined that year but two others disbanded, as happens from time to time. The largest club in membership numbers was Ipswich & District MCC and at the time the Centre Board meetings were also held there. Notable clubs operating and affiliated in that period were:- Southend Auto Club, Dalston MCC, Ilford and District MCC, Bury St Edmunds and District MCC, Wymondham Motor Club and Diss and District MCC. Several motorcycle clubs were also "Light Car" clubs. Essex had two

– one, the "Essex County Auto Club" and the other, simply: "The Essex Motor Club". Oddly, the Cambridge and County Motor Club was included in this Centre, rather than the South Midland. At the end of 1923, the Centre contained over five hundred members and was growing fast. The wackiest club name of all, must surely be the "Pelly Wheelers C and M.C." and my suspicion is that it was originally a bicycle club. I have no idea where it was based but I think that title alone is a rare historical indication that before the "motor" in "motorcycle", there had to be the "cycle" and that it all developed from the pedal pushers. Truly, we are indeed an: "Auto-Cycle Union"

- most of the time.

"With sadness, to let you all know, that Steve Brace passed away peacefully after a short battle with cancer. He will be greatly missed."

He was elected to the Track Racing Committee and specialised in the technical area, rewriting and updating the technical rules.



More recently he was asked to join the FIM as a technical director, the Speedway Control Board also recruited him to take on technical duties in the sport of Speedway and he became part of the technical team at the Cardiff GP.

He was a larger than life character and always approached his duties with a smile and attempted to help riders solve any technical problems found during technical inspection, he will be sadly missed by the many that knew him.

He leaves a wife and a son, and in the last few days before his death he became a proud grandfather for the first time.



Circuits in the Eastern Centre

I have recently thought back to all of the motocross/scramble venues in the Eastern region that I can recall during my lifetime, and have listed an amazing 49!

It is possible that I have forgotten one or two, (old age is my excuse), so maybe readers of the gazette may well add to the list. I know that Dave Orbell and others did an exercise on the subject a year or two ago, and it made interesting reading, so I hope that my notes on these circuits brings back memories for older followers of the sport, and indeed, enlighten younger people of the many clubs that hosted these events over the past 70 odd years.

Starting at the northern end of the Eastern Centre, Cadders Hill at Lyng is the first port of call. Fortunately, the Norwich Viking club is still putting on meetings each year at one of the UK's premier circuits, and Val and Andrew Hay have taken over the mantle of the legend that was Dennis Slaughter. Apart from Centre meetings, the busy club hosts National Championships, and in the past have run Inter Centre meetings, and Dennis fulfilled his dream in running a World 125cc Grand Prix back in the day.

Sculthorpe was another Norfolk venue, as well as Grimes Farm out on the Norfolk coast, where, I believe, the host club was the Stalham Saints. Dave Cordle tells me that he won his first junior final there, but I must admit that I never visited either of these circuits. I remember going to the one off meeting at Snetterton, which was hosted by the Norfolk and Suffolk Combine. I recall that the late Colin Armes arranged this, along with help from Dennis. Colin, of course, was very much involved with the road race scene, and they sorted out the track which included what was called a bombhole.

Not far from Snetterton of course, is Hockham, the home of the Norfolk and Suffolk junior club. Originally started by fathers who had retired from the sport, the club has seen many a young rider progressing to National status, and the legend , Dave Bickers, and many others were involved in running meetings in the early days.

Although technically, the Littleport club is situated in Cambridgeshire, which comes under the South Midland Centre, The club affiliated to the Eastern Centre back in the early 1980,s I believe. Despite

only a handful of people involved, the club still soldiers on, and have plans to stage events at Buttercup farm, Chatteris this year. They have used many venues over the years, including Old Bank Littleport, Stoke Ferry, Beck Row, Mepal, West Dereham, Chippenham and Mildenhall. Beck Row on the outskirts of Mildenhall was used for quite a few years, and I recall my good friend, Kiwi Ivan Miller and Stuart Nunn battling it out on several occasions. My memory takes me back to when I was around 14 years old, and I travelled to Old Bank Littleport with Peter Mitchell, who had just purchased a new Greeves. (Peter's son, Mark, went on to twice win the Eastern title). The final race of the day was an 8 lap handicap race, and Peter led every lap, but was passed by the late great Brian Stonebridge on the final corner. Peter had great delight in telling everyone that he had nearly beaten one of the all time greats, but I had not the heart to remind him that Stonebridge had given him a lap start!

Younger readers will be amazed to learn that there were at least 27 circuits that I can recall in the county of Suffolk over a 70 year span. Hopefully, with the editors permission, I will continue in the next edition. (*Permission granted! Ed*)

Any numbers not renewed by 31st January have now been made available on a first come, first served basis. To ride in an ACU Eastern electronically timed meeting yu MUST have a reserved number. There were about 700 numbers sold in each of the last 4 years so if you want a specific number, reserve it as soon as possible.

You can reserve a new number from 4th February at www.easternacu.org


The cost of reserving your number for 2022 remains unchanged at £5.50 per season. This ensures that the chosen charities (East Anglian Air Ambulance, Essex Air Ambulance & ACU Benevolent Fund) receive just over £5 per transaction.

Numbers 1 – 50 are kept for experts only. Number 1 is reserved for the Centre Champion.

Since its introduction this scheme has enabled the ACU Eastern, on behalf of riders, to make donations of more than £30,000 to the chosen charities.
