2020 ACU EASTERN YOUTH MOTOCROSS CHAMPIONSHIP

DATES AND VENUES

4 rounds – all to count

1. MEETINGS

These competitions will be held each year over 4 youth meetings selected by the ACU Eastern Motocross Committee.

2. PERMIT

ACU Eastern Youth Championship meetings must be run under an Open Permit. A restricted to club permit is not acceptable.

3. TITLE

Each meeting shall be titled the
“ACU Eastern Youth Motocross Championship (Year) Round No.....”
(To appear on all documents and advertising)

4. CLASSES

There will be five classes:

(1) Auto (2) 65cc (3) S/W 85cc (4) B/W 85cc (5) Open (youth)

5. ENTRIES

All riders entering an ACU Eastern Championship round will be taking part in the Championship. All points scored will count towards the relevant ACU Eastern Youth Motocross Championship

6. RACES

All races (legs) of a Championship meeting count towards the Championship.

The duration of each race is to be as follows: (minimum 5 riders)

| 1) Auto | 6 mins + 1 lap |
| 2) 65cc | 9 mins + 1 lap |
| 3) S/W 85cc | 10 mins + 1 lap |
| 4) B/W 85cc | 12 mins + 1 lap |
| 5) Open (youth) | 14 mins + 1 lap |

7. START

The start must be of a live engine clutch type.

8. POINTS

Points will be awarded for each race.

Points are awarded on the following scale:-

1st - 45 points, 2nd - 42 points, 3rd - 40 points, 4th -38 points, 5th - 36 points, 6th - 35 points and then reducing by one point per position until 40th - 1 point.

9. RESULTS

The rider gaining the most points from all 4 rounds will be declared the "ACU Eastern Youth Motocross Champion (Class) (Year)".

10. TIES

In the event of a tie on the total number of points scored the individual Champion will be decided in favour of the rider gaining the greatest number of first places, failing which the greater number of second places and so on. In the event of a tie still existing, then the rider who gains the highest position in the last race.

11. RECORDING OF RESULTS

It is the responsibility of each club organising a Championship meeting to Send, within 7 days of the event, **a completed programme including each riders nominated club and official results to:-**

- 1) The Youth Motocross Championship Recorder via the MX Sub Committee.
- 2) The Steward of the Meeting

Each organiser must include in their programme the current positions of the Championship Class which are being held at the meeting, details of which will be available from the Youth Championship Recorder, via the MX Sub Committee.

12. AWARDS

The Centre Annual Trophies, as described below, will be awarded to the individual Champions and may be held by the champion until requested for return by the centre, they may not be won outright. ACU Eastern may require a written undertaking to return the trophy when requested. Replicas, for permanent keepsake will be given to the Champions. Should the Individual Champion not be resident within the Centre boundaries, the trophy will be engraved with the name of that Champion and may be presented to the winner at the Centre Function. However, the trophy will be returned immediately that evening to the Centre for safe keeping as it will not be permitted to leave the Centre boundary.

The award will be the "Triangle (Ipswich) MCC Trophy" for the ACU Eastern Youth Motocross Championship.....Class Trophies will be awarded for the following classes:-

- 1) Auto
- 2) 65cc
- 3) S/W 85cc
- 4) B/W 85cc
- 5) Open (youth)

13. The decision of the ACU Eastern Motocross Committee on all matters relating to these Championship competitions shall be final.
